Here's a common process that students go through:

1. Get Information

- a. Check out the website
- b. Call or email an Admissions Representative at admissions@weimar.edu or 530.422.7950.
- c. Start an online application at <http://weimar.edu/admissions/apply-online/>. This is the most important step you can take if you are interested in Weimar Institute.

2. Submit Your Application

Below is a list of things that you will need to complete an application. Most of these application components can be found directly within your online application. Any additional forms will be sent to you by our Admissions team.

3. Admissions Interview

Once your application has been submitted, we will schedule you for an admissions interview with a Weimar Institute staff member. This interview is designed to get to know you and your academic goals better. The interview typically takes 30-60 min. to complete.

4. Admissions Committee

Once you have completed your application, submitted all necessary application documentation and interviewed with one of the deans, your application file will be given to the Admissions Committee. During the Admissions Committee meeting, the committee members determine whether your application will be accepted or declined.

5. Acceptance

- a. Once your application to Weimar Institute has been accepted, you will be sent confirmation via email and postal letter (if your address is within the U.S.).

International Students must submit the following in addition to the regular admissions documents.

- TOEFL scores if English is not your native language
- Bank Statements that demonstrate ability to pay required tuition
- \$2700 International Student Deposit
