HEALTH (Health Evangelism and Leadership Training for Him) is a four-month certificate program specifically designed to produce effective health educators/coaches who will assist people to gain and maintain optimal physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual health. In cooperation with churches, schools, and professional offices, HEALTH graduates will be equipped to effectively use health outreach as Jesus did: as the “entering wedge” of the gospel.

1. Is a comprehensive four-month health evangelism leadership curriculum with emphasis on practical experience.

Since August 2017, Weimar University's weekly service program called Total Community Involvement (TCI) has gotten attention. Even peer reviewers from an accrediting team have especially recognized TCI and its impact.

Each week, students, faculty and staff spend a half-day meeting individual and group needs in the surrounding communities. It's yardwork, decluttering, helping people moving, health education for individuals and groups, healthy cooking demos, visiting with invalids and the lonely, and more.
