

“Weimar University has been sustained by a large and bold vision: educating young people for a lifetime of mission service to God and humanity.”





Weimar Students—a Select Group

Since restarting Weimar College—now Weimar University—in 2009, I have continually heard our faculty say Weimar students are the best they have ever taught. This is remarkable, for many of these professors have taught in other institutions of higher learning. They comment on the students' unusual friendliness, helpfulness, gratitude, and motivation. Our professors also mention their enjoyment of Weimar students' thought-provoking questions.

A Documented Difference

Our high regard for our students is not just a subjective or biased opinion. *Independent DAAT (Depression and Anxiety Test)* testing has documented

the Weimar difference. Weimar students score far above average in emotional intelligence (EQ), and their EQ goes even higher after studying at Weimar. EQ is a measure of how well we understand our emotions and the emotions of others, as well as how well we respond to those emotions. It has proven to be the most accurate predictor of an individual's future success and productivity. It is a far better indicator of our ability to develop satisfying relationships than our IQ, which measures our general intelligence. On average, our students enter Weimar slightly above the 80th percentile in emotional intelligence for their age group; one semester later, their average increases to the 95th percentile.



A Threefold Ministry—Weimar's Secret Sauce

Weimar University surveys highlight the fact that our students, faculty, and staff desire to follow Christ's model of a threefold ministry:

1. Proclaim the good news of the gospel
2. Participate in true and practical education
3. Relieve sickness and afflictions in those around us

Weimar exists to train students to engage effectively in this threefold ministry. It's part of our DNA. It guides our admission and hiring policies, is foundational to the curriculum, and drives our outreach activities.

Our endeavor to accomplish this ministry provides students with tools to work with people of different cultures, ages,

perspectives, and struggles. At Weimar University, students learn ways to improve their own lives as they improve the lives of others—physically, mentally, socially, and spiritually. It teaches students how to impart their knowledge to bless those around them.

Meet the Vice President of Academic Affairs



Jesson Martin, Ph.D., joined Weimar University as the Vice President of Academic Affairs (V.P.A.A.) on July 1, 2022. Dr. Martin previously served as a Professor of Optometry at the University of Pikeville Kentucky College of Optometry, located in the heart of the beautiful Appalachian hills, where he was also a founding faculty member. He comes with 25 years of experience in academia, research, and the medical field. Dr. Martin holds a Ph.D. and two master degrees in physics.

Tell us about your teaching formula.

"I enjoy teaching very much, and my formula is to keep it *simple, concise, and relevant*. This formula has been very effective for me with my graduate optometry students. I tell my students the most important thing is to *understand* the topic at hand."

What do you most enjoy about your research so far?

"Every year I attend a conference on vision research and ophthalmology where more than 12,000 researchers from around the world gather to present their work on various aspects of the one-inch eyeball. Yet, we are still only scratching the surface of it. The human eye is a fascinating organ which speaks to God's creative power. Every component of the eye has been precisely placed to produce vision."

So, why Weimar?

"God made my family and me realize that living for a larger cause is far better than merely living the American dream. It's a

great honor to join Weimar University, and it's a privilege to work with a visionary leader like President Nedley and a committed team of employees. How do you feel after spending a few months at Weimar University as the V.P.A.A.?

"Weimar University is a one-of-a-kind, model school where comprehensive and balanced Christian education is provided. Character building and compassionate service are our primary focus. Each course taught here meticulously integrates Science and Scripture. I am thrilled by our faculty's commitment to providing a high-quality education. Our students are provided with an array of opportunities to gain knowledge and training in the skills which will prepare them for current and future

challenges. Typically, students joining Weimar have a deep sense of calling and commitment to a purposeful life."

How do you listen to your constituents?

"My office door is always open to my faculty, staff, and students. I am available for them when they need me. I communicate with students, faculty, and staff weekly through my email newsletter. We have a college assembly every Monday, sometimes converting it into a 'town hall' meeting."

"Our university believes in shared governance. Our faculty and staff participate in decision-making by serving on various committees as part of their service. We have an efficient top-down and bottom-up communication system on campus. We consider academic integrity and transparency to be the cornerstones of our academic excellence."

What are your current and future plans for the University?

"I have individual ideas and plans, but we plan and grow together at Weimar University. We have an effective and functional administrative team and a leadership team led by our president, which allows us to plan for the current and future goals collectively. We operate based on the five-year strategic plan developed by the corporate effort of our entire campus. That plan is our frame of reference in terms of growth. Of course, as a leader of the university, I have plans to grow the number of programs offered, strengthen our current programs, bring in relevant graduate-level and certification courses, and grow the student body."

Finally, tell us about your family.
"I am married to Jenifer Kowsalya, an electronics and communication engineer, who homeschooled our three children until last year: Judith, a Junior in college; Edith, a senior in the academy; and Walden, a sophomore in the academy."



Total Community Involvement (T.C.I.)

Total Community Involvement (T.C.I.) is a campus-wide friendship evangelism initiative which utilizes Christ's methods for teaching, preaching, and healing in the local communities surrounding Weimar University.

Each Wednesday, multiple groups of about 10 students, faculty, and staff set aside their studies and work to serve others in the community. These groups complete



various tasks, including yard work, house cleaning, and cutting and stacking wood. They also work in teams to organize and implement community programs, such as diabetes reversal classes, cooking demonstrations, health expositions, and other similar topics. Students spend time with community members and provide them Bible studies, lifestyle coaching, tutoring, etc. There is even a group dedicated to serving the community children at the local park each week.

As students from both the academy and university work among the people of our community in this unique program, they develop valuable skills as spiritual leaders, health evangelists, and conscientious workers. Through the formation of lasting relationships resulting from friendship evangelism, the goal is that these earthly friendships will lead to eternal ones.

people made decisions for Christ. We are grateful to the Weimar University media department who compiled a video of our work on the island:





The Weimar University Religion department sets out to prepare students for various ministry appointments, including pastoral, educational, and missionary ministry engagements. The program aims to help students gain an experimental knowledge of God through the systematically guided study of the sacred Scriptures. An integral part of Weimar University's philosophy includes comprehensive health and wellness as a part of personal and professional development.

Taking the model of Jesus, which includes preaching, teaching, and healing, students train to minister to make man whole. The fundamental doctrines of Scripture form a bedrock of broad academic preparation and engagement upon which we prepare workers to serve the church in pastoral or related capacities “To Heal a Hurting World.”

Weimar University is a strong unit which offers a richness of cultural and ethnic diversity in the student body, faculty, and staff. Yet this deep diversity is captured in a population size small enough to experience like a family. Everyone gets to know everyone. Within this family are Religion faculty from three continents with diverse academic backgrounds.

The department offers a B.A. in Religion with potential emphases in Theology (fulfills all pre-seminary requirements), Religious Studies, or Worship Studies. Students in this program are exposed to and participate in numerous personal and professional growth experiences as well as a variety of community engagements, including T.C.I. and yearly mission trips, which expose students to active ministry

Student Spotlight

Nicolas Hold, a senior Religion/Theology, Business, and Natural Science/Pre-Medical student with aspirations to become a pastor, has greatly appreciated his wholistic education and training at Weimar University. In the classroom, he has learned how to correctly interpret the Bible (hermeneutics), preach the gospel (homiletics), and answer tough questions about God and Scripture (apologetics). Through T.C.I., he has gained knowledge on how to reach both the secular and religious through acts of compassion and love. He has acquired theoretical and practical experience in medical missionary work through health coaching, NEWSTART™, and the Depression and Anxiety Recovery Program™.

A notable moment of Nicolas' experience at Weimar was the Depression and Anxiety Recovery Program™ clinical course, where he shadowed the chaplain and participated in all the program's activities with the patients. He saw firsthand the uncompromisingly scientific approach of teaching the Biblical health and healing message, the effect of true love and compassion for each participant as demonstrated by the staff, and the beautiful, variegated ways the gospel message does its work in each person. Nicolas was amazed by how the chaplain was able to reach the hearts of people from all—or no—religious backgrounds and walks of life. Many of the participants made life-changing decisions to follow God's plan for their lives and take hold of His power to give them the self-control necessary for long-term success.

As Nicolas got to know the participants, he learned one of them was from Georgia. Being from there also, he asked, “What part?” “A little town called Blue Ridge,” she answered. “That’s where I am from!” he exclaimed. He wondered if his dad, who is a well-known dentist in town, had referred her, but she had not heard of him or even of Seventh-day Adventism. At the end of the program, this patient made the commitment to never go back to her addictions but to use the beneficial tools and lifestyle practices she had learned and was already starting to incorporate into her life. She was discharged with a remarkable recovery.

The program ended the week of the university's spring break. Both going home, Nicolas invited her to attend the Blue Ridge Seventh-day Adventist Church. He was speaking that Sabbath. She accepted his invitation and attended for the first time. Thrilled, she invited her family to attend with her the following week. What a divine appointment! Nicolas chose to take this clinical course at the same time as a woman from his own small town, with God using that connection to help him lead her to Jesus.

Reflecting on his experience, Nicolas states: “I believe the Depression and Anxiety Recovery Program™ rotation is vital to the education of students at Weimar University. It demonstrates the practical use of the health information we know and the religious information we have, combining them in loving care for others. So many people in my generation struggle with their mental health. Learning how to work to reverse depression and anxiety is enormously useful. It was life-changing for me to see the amazing transformation of lives which took place during the program.”

Pre-Medical / Pre-Dental / Pre-Allied Health

The Natural Science program builds on the rich medical missionary heritage of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, balancing scientific study with applied learning. The program prepares students to pursue further studies in health-related fields, including but not limited to medicine, dentistry, physician's assistant, physical therapy, public health, dietetics, or secondary science education.

The program focuses on core science subjects, such as chemistry, biology, physics, and their related sub-disciplines, which are foundational to success in their postgraduate study. These courses are taught from a decidedly Biblical perspective and health-based focus. The academic rigor of the courses is combined with practical, hands-on experiences. Many students pursue the Health and Wellness minor alongside the Natural Science major, which includes clinical rotations in the medical settings of the NEWSTART™ Lifestyle Program and the Depression and Anxiety Recovery


Program™. Students also can be involved in local, national, and international mission experiences as a part of this degree.

Altogether, these concentrations of study provide the prerequisites and spiritual preparation for entry into varied postgraduate fields of study. Students are prepared for the rigors of future professional training. They are also given experience in and an appreciation for being medical missionaries.

Students who successfully finish this program of study will have a broad understanding of health and natural healing techniques, which will significantly enhance their future effectiveness as medical missionary health professionals.

The purpose of the nursing program at Weimar University is to prepare students to be medical missionaries at home and abroad, sharing the love of Jesus at the bedside and beyond. “The evangelization of the world is the work that God has given to those who go forth in His name” (ML, p. 224). “The Christian nurse, while administering treatment for the restoration of health, will pleasantly and successfully draw the mind of the patient to Christ, the healer of the soul as well as of the body” (MH, p. 223).

The A.S. in Nursing program graduates are not only equipped to be medical ministers but are also well qualified for nursing licensure. They also learn to teach healthful living principles and practice natural remedies, such as hydrotherapy and massage.

Weimar University also offers an R.N. to B.S. in Nursing program. Upon completion, graduates are supplied with additional knowledge and practice in preventing chronic illness and teaching healthful living principles. This knowledge stems from participation in health programs, such as the NEWSTART™ Lifestyle Program and the Depression and Anxiety Recovery Program™, and practice in health and lifestyle coaching in the community. In addition, they are prepared for potential certification in areas of great demand, such as public health nursing, lifestyle medicine, and health and wellness coaching.

An element which makes the education program unique is the teaching opportunity it provides its students. Working as a student teacher turns textbook knowledge into tangible experiences. The years of teaching experience I’ve received in the elementary school on campus have enabled me to gain confidence in my classroom management abilities, developed my skills in lesson planning, and been an avenue whereby my character is being refined.

Before starting this degree, I thought being a teacher would

be straightforward and easy. But I have grown to realize this is not always the case. There was one instance when I was teaching a Bible class in which I struggled to work with a student. They seemed stubborn and disengaged in class and would often be uncooperative in filling out assignments, such as their ‘prayer requests and praises’ sheet. Discouraged, I came to my supervisor, not knowing what to do as it seemed no form of classroom management would work for the situation. To my surprise, she challenged me to pray harder for this student. Though I was hesitant, I took it on. I prayed for this student relentlessly for weeks. One day, when I came to see what they wrote down on their ‘prayer requests and praises’ sheet, I saw the following: ‘I am praying that all my friends and I go to heaven.’

In the book *Evangelism*, teachers are counseled to ‘teach them [the children] that the Saviour is calling them, that nothing can afford Him greater joy than for them to give themselves to Him in the bloom and freshness of their years’ (p. 580). In a world where Satan longs to distort the minds of our precious children, teachers are called to safeguard them from influences which could hinder their desire for God. To lead, fashion, and train young minds for Christ is a high calling and privilege. I highly treasure my opportunity to be involved in this ministry. It excites me to know that this is what God has called me to do for the rest of my life.”

Remember, as you prepare for your future, be sure you are not training only for a future which will someday no longer exist. Train for eternity. No matter your career, psychology can help you utilize it







Students in the Biblical Mission and Wellness program receive unique training in effectively sharing the gospel message and Biblical health principles together, ministering to peoples' holistic needs and well-being. This combination alone can free people from the ailments and addictions which plague the human race.

Our students' instruction as missionaries is patterned after the threefold ministry of Jesus in preaching, teaching, and healing. They are educated in gospel doctrine, prayer, Biblical hermeneutics, methods of persuasion, and discipleship. They are trained and mentored to plant new churches, revive declining churches, start centers of influence, enter new areas where the gospel is not well known, and much more.

Central to the students' need is knowledge in the science of faith and prayer. The work they will be engaged in is supernatural. The dark, unseen forces of evil are locked in a controversy with God's character of light and unselfish love. As the students engage in missionary endeavors, they must acquire God's supernatural power of mercy and love to overcome humanity's enslavement brought on by sin. We seek to impart this knowledge in every aspect of our program.

Cafeteria



Weimar University is the only accredited university in the world which serves solely plant-based, vegan food on the entire campus. The cafeteria is the heart of serving the majority of these wholesome and delicious meals. The main cafeteria clients are university and academy students, the NEWSTART™ Lifestyle Program guests, and the Depression and Anxiety Recovery Program™ participants. Public visitors can walk in from Sunday to Friday to eat and can reserve a Sabbath lunch at least a day ahead of time. Heeding closely to the original diet found in Genesis and the diet Daniel ate, the cafeteria prepares two full meals a day. There is also a light supper for those who desire it. Each meal at the cafeteria brings diners an enjoyable opportunity for nourishment, rest, relaxation, and socialization.

The cafeteria nourishes its customers with clean, satisfying, and healthful meals which invigorate the mind and body. The meal plan accommodates a diabetic diet by consisting of whole grains, beans, nuts, seeds, fresh fruits, and vegetables. Multiple varieties of whole fruits are served for breakfast, and up to 10 different fresh vegetables, sprouts, and beans are set on the salad bar for lunch.

Raw nuts and seeds are provided to give the daily essential nutrients for mental and physical fitness. Veteran chefs and staff prepare freshly-cooked hot meals daily as well as homemade, low-fat salad dressings and condiments. A variety of delicious, whole-grain breads are baked in-house to complement each meal, being served along with various kinds of natural nut butters, honey, and molasses for a hint of sweetness. Every part of the meal contributes to increased cognitive function, better memory, sustained attention, and positive behavior.

Above all things, we wish to help everyone prosper and be in health. Whatever the cafeteria makes, everything is prayerfully done for the glory of God.



Weimar Farm provides certified organic produce to not only our cafeteria, but also to 10 supermarkets and retail outlets within a 25-mile radius. Over the years, the community has come to associate the name “Weimar Farm” with amazing-tasting, quality produce. Marketing has not been necessary because of word of mouth from our customers; as one produce manager said: “your produce just flies off the shelf!”

What makes our produce special? Weimar University’s focus is on blessing and ministering to the needs of our community. The farm is on the front line of this effort with the tasty produce introducing people to the “something better” Weimar offers. You might be thinking, “how do you achieve growing better-tasting produce?” At the farm, we treat the soil, which supplies the nutrients to the plants, with attention to the Creator’s design. The balance of minerals in our bodies are kept in balance

by consuming produce which has the same mineral ratios in the soil. We nurture the microbiome around the roots to give the plants good health. This in turn makes the food grown nutrient dense and full of phytochemicals. Preventive medicine actually starts in the soil.

Most of the students graduating from Weimar University will have taken a course in agriculture on our farm. They, along with the privileged students who work there (both the university and the academy offer this option), get to taste the difference and have their minds revitalized by the Creator’s prescription for optimal mental and physical performance.





College Residential Dormitory Renovation

We are beyond blessed to see an increase in enrollment. With the demand growing for a Weimar education, our projection for this upcoming school year is that our existing housing will be at capacity, with some of our students sharing a room with not just one roommate, but two. Our Weimar family wholeheartedly welcomes each new student, and our students have told us they would rather be a bit cramped than not be here at all, but we only have so many housing accommodations.

More difficult than trying to find space for another student is having to turn one away due to a lack of room. When this happens, there are tears—and not just on their part. We share their disappointment. We have seen their longing to be here, make godly friends, grow in their academic, practical, and leadership skills, and explore a deeper relationship with God. This has motivated us to find an economical, timely solution.

Our plan is to renovate one of our existing buildings to house 42 more students. We have received approval from the county to start renovating. We praise God that \$450,000 of the \$750,000 projected cost has already been raised.

With your help, we can raise the rest of the money and begin the renovations this summer. Your gift, regardless of size, allows us to bring more students to our campus in comfortable and enjoyable housing, not only for next school year, but for many more to come.


