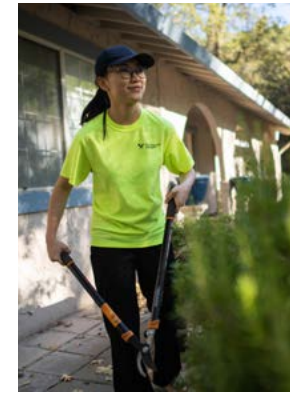

Since August 2017, Weimar University's weekly service program called Total Community Involvement (TCI) has gotten attention. Even peer reviewers from an accrediting team have especially recognized TCI and its impact.

Each week, students, faculty, and staff spend a half-day meeting individual and group needs in the surrounding communities. It's yardwork, decluttering, helping people moving, health education for individuals and groups, healthy cooking demos, visiting with invalids and the lonely, and more.
